Audience

Landowners and persons considering land ownership who are interested in managing their land will find this workshop an exceptional opportunity. Anyone with forest cover on part of their property will learn how to practice sustainable forestry and manage the land to meet their objectives. The course introduces you to best management practices for protecting the environment, discusses different prescriptions for management, intensive management practices and wildlife management.

This workshop is designed for people who have completed Master Tree Farmer Level One, or who have experience with forest management activities.

Locations

The course will be conducted in Aiken, Camden, Clemson, Florence, Georgetown, Greenville, Greenwood, Moncks Corner, Newberry, Orangeburg, and Walterboro. Each location will have a Program Coordinator and an Area Forester handling the program for their site. The speakers for each session will present their material to the group in Clemson. Their presentation will be delivered to each site via satellite. There will be a toll-free number participants can use to ask questions of the presenters. Questions will also be handled at the local level.

Registration

Each attendee will pay \$80 for the course. Couples will pay \$110 and will receive one set of handout materials. Couples wishing two complete sets of materials need to pay \$80 each. Registrants will receive a notebook with chapters on seven topics. Persons completing six of the seven sessions will receive a certificate and a Master Tree Farmer II cap. Refreshments will be provided each evening. The deadline for registration is January 28, 2002. The late registration fee is \$100, and will be accepted until February 12, 2002.
