COORDINATION OF ATA CONCLAVES WITH
NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF STUDENT TEACHERS
IN AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION

National ATA Conclaves have been held annually* since 1935. The National Conference of Student Teachers in Agriculture Education has met annually since the early 1950s. The earliest recorded information indicating that the two conferences shared programming is reported by Dr. Orville E. Thompson, National Secretary-Treasurer, in the "Minutes and Report, Twenty-Fifth Annual National Alpha Tau Alpha Conclave, October 13-14-15, 1964," p. 10, stating:

The conclave was adjourned at 3:40 p.m. so delegates could register for the National Student Teacher Conference, attend the NVATA coffee hour, and attend the dinner for student teachers...

Since that time, the two organizations have continued the relationship of sharing speakers and professional activities during their national meetings.

According to records currently available, in 1978 the two groups agreed to organize their meetings concurrently, with one student organization acting as "Host" to coordinate with the National ATA officers the programming used by both conferences.

In 1982, the combined groups renamed their conference the "National Collegiate Agricultural Education Conference," with the National ATA Conclave conducted as a part of the conference.
