The CAC.C is available to third-, fourth-year, and graduate students in architecture and landscape architecture.

what

The CAC.C is a hybrid experience: a cross between school and the profession.

where

CAC.C studios are in Charleston's historic Marine Hospital; next door are wood and metal shops in the historic Jail.

curriculum

Coursework at the CAC.C comes in four types: the Intern Program, craft labs, service-learning studios, and lecture/seminar courses. Offerings vary by semester, allowing students to study in Charleston for consecutive semesters without duplicating content. The CAC.C academic calendar is different from that on the main campus. intern program

The CAC.C has sponsorship arrangements with architects, landscape architects, urban designers, contractors, and craftspersons. CAC.C students who interview well and are awarded an Intern position receive pay and credit for on-the-job work/training. See the current CAC.C Intern Program Guide for the latest information.

housing

The CAC.C maintains a stock of 1-, 2-, and 3-bedroom apartments, all within walking/biking distance to its Center, where students are required to live. Rent varies from about \$600-1000/month. See the current CAC.C Housing Program Guide for options and details.

what STUDENTS should know about



what

STUDIO **V** is a fabrication studio in which students learn to design with the poetics of construction.

where

The CAC.C has extensive wood and metal shops, including a laser cutter. We fabricate real projects and installations.

how

STUDIO **V** is an atelier where students work in collaboration with professors, usually on actual design/build projects. Using an iterative method of speculation and fabrication, students learn to design using multi-scale mock-ups. CAC.C public service projects allow students to contribute in a significant way to complex projects—just as in professional practice.

why

Buildings are complex. STUDIO **V** teaches students to incorporate the complexities of materials and construction in the design process.

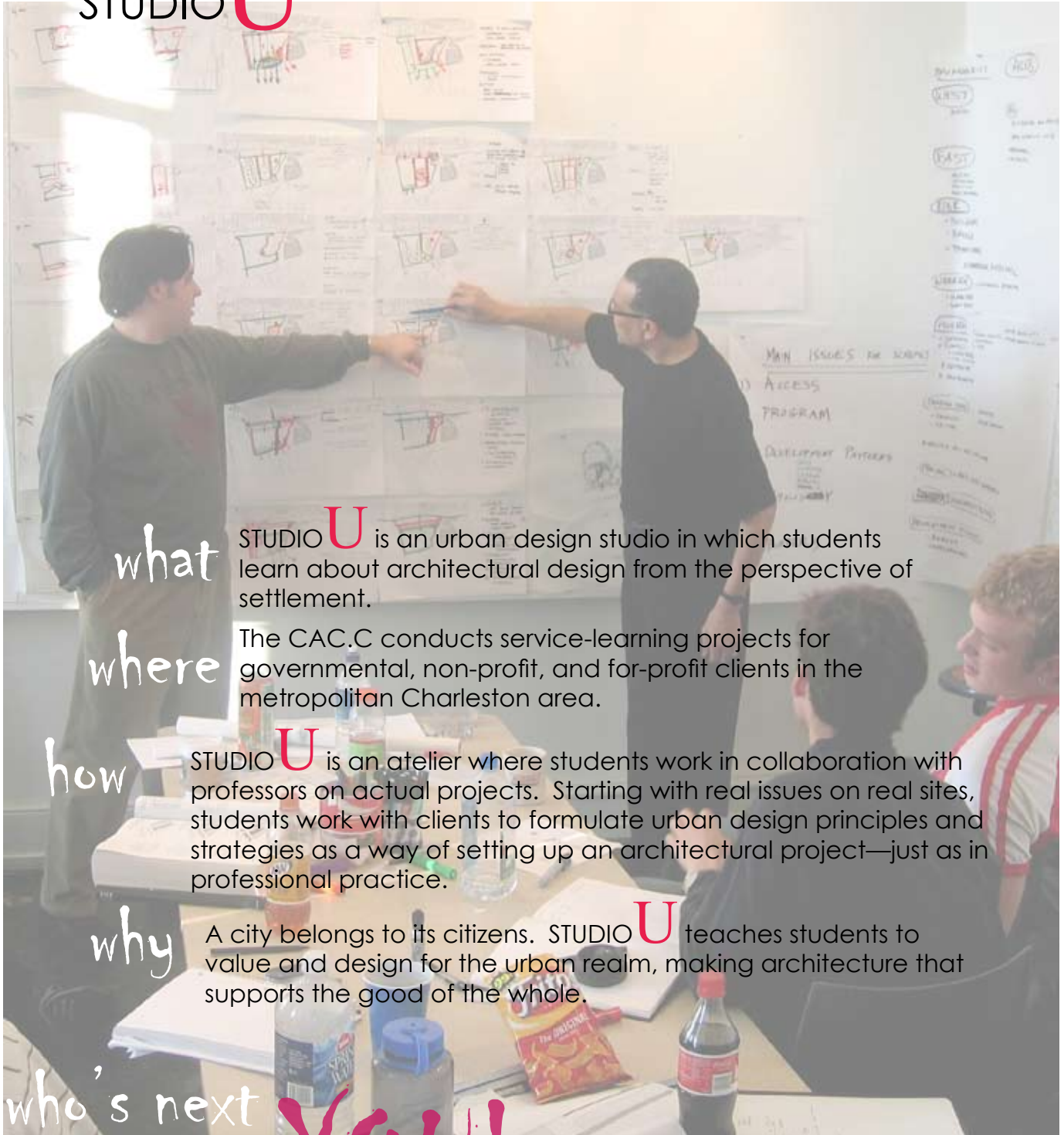

what

STUDIO U is an urban design studio in which students learn about architectural design from the perspective of settlement.

where

The CAC.C conducts service-learning projects for governmental, non-profit, and for-profit clients in the metropolitan Charleston area.

how

STUDIO U is an atelier where students work in collaboration with professors on actual projects. Starting with real issues on real sites, students work with clients to formulate urban design principles and strategies as a way of setting up an architectural project—just as in professional practice.

why

A city belongs to its citizens. STUDIO U teaches students to value and design for the urban realm, making architecture that supports the good of the whole.
