RECOGNIZE IT.

Clemson University defines hazing as intentionally or recklessly engaging in acts which have a foreseeable potential for causing physical or emotional harm to any person for the purpose of initiation or admission into or affiliation with any chartered student, fraternal or sorority organization.

Myth: Hazing only occurs in Greek organizations.

Fact: Hazing can occur in any organization including athletics, military, business, civil or social organizations.

Myth: As long as I do not participate in an act of hazing, I cannot get in trouble.

Fact: The South Carolina Law states that it is unlawful for any knowing person to fail to report knowledge of hazing acts.

Myth: I do not have the power to stop hazing.

Fact: Regardless of your participation in student organizations, you can help stop hazing. Becoming more aware of hazing issues and educating students are two steps that will help prevent/stop hazing.

Myth: Hazing is only a physical act.

Fact: Although some acts of hazing are physical, hazing can also be psychological in nature.
