**Minutes**

- Welcome and Introductions
- CCC Business
  - Update on officers: Secretary and Marketing Chair
    - Crystal will ask McKenzie McNamara (new Healthy Campus graduate assistant) to be the incoming Secretary.
    - Crystal will follow up with Mason Hammond about one of the CUSG representatives serving as the Marketing Chair.
  - Reviewed the CCC Year-End Report (see attached)
    - Aspire to be Well: 5,898 Clemson first year and transfer students completed an Aspire to be Well session during Fall 2017 (98% total completion rate). 287 transfer students completed an Aspire session during Spring 2018 (95% completion). 95% of learning outcomes showed statistically significant improvement from pre- to post-tests.
    - This spring, IFC implemented a ban on social events and a new social policy.
      - Question about video cameras in fraternity chapter facilities. Suggestion from Tate to encourage chapters to look into this. James Gowan from CUPD could help provide expertise about installing cameras.
    - Areas of improvement:
      - Continued goal of connecting with the downtown residents to hear their concerns and offer an opportunity to get involved. Established neighborhood associations are the likely avenue. We haven't had much success through attempts in the past.
        - Crystal will contact Crossie Cox for suggestions and to get connected.
      - Member continuity: When a CCC member changes jobs or their leadership position, goal that CCC membership would stay consistent and transition to the next individual.
      - Potential new members: CCC members are encouraged provide their ideas for new potential CCC members.
      - Marking CCC success and activities: It's helpful for the community to hear about how we are working on AOD risk reduction in our area.

- Future directions:
      - StepUp Facilitators to present the training to fraternity and sorority members, as well as other student and community groups.
      - Create marketing and/or highlight in our newsletter the different training opportunities that are tied together through CCC partnerships.
      - Increase utilization of the Rave Guardian app: The CCC could help market the app since it aligns with our goals. This could be especially effective in September during Campus Safety month.
        - A new iteration of the Rave Guardian app is coming out soon that'll feature a partnership with Uber. This is especially helpful for when students may feel unsafe with Uber driver. Clemson University is working to increase in the number of students, faculty, and staff who use the app.
        - Important to stress to students that CUPD does not store data on students.
        - Kristi – Mention the Rave Guardian app as a resource in Tigers Together.
      - Leadership team to articulate the value of CCC members
    - August meeting: Review the bylaws and Aspire to be Well results presentation

  - Clemson University
    - Step Up bystander intervention training
      - Materials should be out soon to prepare for training this fall. The schedule for FSL trainings in the fall should be out by the end of July.
  - Updates from the group
    - Leasa Evinger – Housing move-out/closing went well. This is a draft of the move-in schedule:
      - Early move-in for Panhellenic recruitment: August 13
        - Panhellenic bid-day: Sunday, August 19, 7:00am
      - Returning student move-in begins: Thursday, August 16

    - Kimberly Poole – Chana has resigned, June 2<sup>nd</sup> was her last day.
    - Harriett-Graham – IFC recruitment is week of September 16. Pushed back because potential new members will participate in education beforehand.
      - All men have to sign up to take all trainings (e.g. StepUp) by August 31 in order to qualify for recruitment.
      - The goal is for all IFC men to be trained before IFC bid-night.
      - Panhellenic chapters will complete StepUp training in August.
