Study-Abroad Opportunities

Spring 2010:

EUROPE:

Description: An international business law course during spring semester that includes a trip to Europe over spring break. MBA students register for LAW 620 (International Business Law) and attend class one night per week (Tuesday evening) on campus during Spring semester 2010, with a trip to London, Brussels and Paris over Spring Break. While in Europe, the group will visit organizations such as the London Court of International Arbitration, EU Parliament and Commission, and the International Chamber of Commerce (ICC) International Court of Arbitration. This course can be combined with 2 additional international courses (for example: MGT 888 trip to China and another international business class) to complete an emphasis in international business for MBA students.

Dates: Class meets as regular course in spring semester; trip dates are March 13-March 21, 2010

Estimated Costs: \$2,400 trip fee + 3 hours tuition, books, and CU study abroad fees + food and personal expenses. (Trip fee includes airfare, lodging, ground transportation, and medical insurance.)

Application Deadline: November 15, 2009

Summer 2010:

CHINA:

Description: A 2-week trip to China during Clemson's Maymester. Students register for 3 hours of MGT 888 (International Perspectives in Industrial Management); register for section 615 in the summer session 1 course offerings. During the spring semester students are required to study Chinese history, business methods and etiquette. Each student provides an in-depth analysis of a U.S. company operating in China in addition to completing an examination on the required study materials. The group will spend two weeks in China during Maymester touring plants, sight-seeing, and participating in class discussions. Presentations on major economic and political issues will be provided and led by Chinese scholars and members of the business community. This course will count toward any MBA emphasis area.

Dates: May 1–May 14, 2010 (plus preparatory work during spring semester as described above)

Estimated Costs: \$1300 trip fee + airfare (\$1500 in 2009) + 3 hours in-state tuition. (Trip fee includes in-China travel, lodging, most food, visa, sight-seeing.)

ITALY:

Description: CIMBA, Consortium International MBA, offers two intensive summer sessions in Italy. Each session is four weeks in length with classes held Tuesday through Friday after the first week, allowing three long weekends for personal exploration and development. All courses are three credit hours. Students receive transfer credit from The University of Iowa upon completion of the courses. In addition to the classes, students are encouraged to broaden their horizons and become fully immersed in the culture. See the CIMBA website <http://www.cimbaitaly.com/Graduate-192/Index.htm> for details. Specific information for 2010 is not available yet. It should be available in November, 2009.

Dates: Summer Session I typically begins in mid-May and ends in mid-June. Summer Session II usually begins one week following the completion of SSI and runs through the third week of July.

Estimated Costs (based on 2009 tuition/fees): \$4,946 per session (includes tuition for two 3-hour classes, room, some meals, and book usage) + airfare + other travel lodging/food on non-class days
