COURSE MODALITY: Traditional

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course teaches the principles of using computing in the larger context of a system. The student is expected to enter this class with an understanding of computer architecture, assembler, and proficiency programming in the C (or related) language. Emphasis is given to multimedia data (image, sound) as examples of processing found in an embedded system. In concurrent lab work, each student will design and implement many of the ideas that are found in higher end embedded systems.

COURSE PREREQUISITES: ECE 2230 and ECE 3710.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES: Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to apply engineering principles (design, implementation, testing and debugging) to modern embedded computing systems. Graduate students will additionally be ready to apply embedded computing concepts to advanced research problems within the focus area of intelligent systems.

REQUIRED MATERIALS: The student is required to have a laptop computer, internet connectivity capable of transmitting and receiving video, a video camera and a microphone.
