Clemson University's Restoration Institute and the Clemson Conservation Center are seeking to fill a research position to aid project archaeologists with the ongoing three-dimensional reconstruction and analysis of the American Civil War submarine *H.L. Hunley*. The position will entail working with 3D scanning data, provenience information from the excavation, sketches, photographic records, and other archaeological data to develop a digital site plan for the interpretation of site formation processes, including the final positions of the crew and artifacts. Research scholars can expect to receive instruction and training in a number of relevant software packages, as well as practical exposure in illustration, data recording, and 3D surface mapping. Experience with 3D modeling, photography, and Adobe Photoshop are all helpful but not required. Preference will be given to applicants with archaeological training and experience.

The position will be available beginning in the fall of 2008 and last a minimum of four months, but preferably longer. The application deadline is September 15, 2008, or until the position is filled. Stipend and housing will be provided, as well as some reimbursement for travel expenses.

Please be prepared to provide a *Curriculum Vita*, three academic/professional letters of reference, and a brief written description of why this position would be beneficial to you.
