Important! To be eligible for certification, foundation or registered seed must be planted. A bill of sale, invoice or documentary evidence must accompany the application and provide evidence of the source, quantity and class of seed planted. **Additionally, effective July 1, 2002, a certification label representing each seed lot planted must also be submitted with the application.** Growers planting their own registered seed for certified production must show the lot numbers of seed planted.

 - a. That information submitted for verification of seed eligibility represents the total amount of seed used and that only the seed verified as the eligible seed source was planted in the field(s) described on the application.
 - b. That all equipment involved in planting, harvesting, conditioning or other handling of said crop(s), was or will be adequately cleaned to maintain purity of the seed.
 - c. That the identity of the seed will be maintained from harvest time to the time it leaves my possession through the use of an identification system as indicated by the S.C. Seed Certification Standards.
 - d. That I and/or others responsible for conditioning the seed are familiar with and will draw samples from the conditioned seed in accordance with approved sampling procedures in S.C. Seed Certification Standards/

Farm Fee: \$20.00 This may apply on more than one crop on the same farm only if inspection of the different crops can be made on one trip.

Acreage Fees:

Soybeans, Small Grains, Peanuts	\$1.20/acre for the first 100 acres and 70 cents/acre for each acre over 100 plus \$20 Farm Fee.
Grasses and Sod, Okra, and Sweet Potatoes	\$5.00/acre plus \$20.00 Farm Fee
Tobacco	\$3.00/acre plus \$20.00 Farm Fee

Late Fees – with applications more that 15 days late, add an additional \$50.00 plus \$0.50 per acre extra.
