Multi-year approach.

Creating a TAC that is a resource for the basin committees. (Scott W and others)

6) Technical Advisory Committee for the Groundwater Availability Assessment (Joe Gellici, DNR)

First Meeting held: GW availability assessment 6 members: Dr. K Adem Ali (CofC), Clay Duffie (MPW), Ray Gagnon (GCWSD), Michael Yip (GCWSD), Lance Tully (Nestle), Dr. Alicia Wilson (USC). 14 Attendees total including DNR, DHEC, and USGS.

7) Developing Methodologies for Water Demand Forecasts (Alex Pellett, DNR)

GW pumping survey and water use projections. Some registered and permitted users did not receive. Survey will be distributed to identified missed users/sent to committee members. Projections will be out to 2070. Signed an agreement with the Army Corps (Technical Advice on Methodologies) to fund Savannah basin/water demand forecasting and Groundwater projects. TAC – sector specific presentations and meetings to present assumptions and acquire feedback. Dr. Bridges is a statistical addition to the project. Discussion of 50 year horizon. TAC for projections idea to open it up to interested parties, note their opinion and consider for inclusion into the projections. Peer-review process in the water demand projections. Basin advisory councils to weigh-in? What

level do people on front lines know what's best or peer-review process? Need for standardization of projection methods.

Other - Drought response summary document well received by Clay D and suggestion of CISA group/Hope Mizzell SCDNR to help produce documents. Jeff Allen to follow-up with Kristen L at CISA to see what it would cost.
