Introductions

Appling welcomed the committee.

Approval of minutes

The committee approved the May meeting minutes.

New Business

A. Certificate Programs, Multidisciplinary Programs, and Sustainability Minor — Appling stated that Dr. Kitchens has some questions about our certificate programs. Kitchens asked about how certificates and multidisciplinary certificates are handled, or if there is policies surrounding these somewhere. Appling explained that certificate programs has been through the lean process to determine a set of guidelines that allow certificates to be created, tracked, and charged a fee; however, he has not seen anything solidified since the meeting. Appling stated that Automotive Engineering is the only program currently with a fee associated with it because they have two courses specific to the certificate and they split the cost between them. This is a great revenue producing avenue for non-students and professionals. Currently, the undergraduate funding model has not been approved. Wilson stated that certificates are considered an award on the transcripts. Appling stated that Kurz is working with Faculty Senate to develop standing committees and guidelines established for interdisciplinary related courses.

Appling reported that Leidy Klotz was the person who spearheaded the Sustainability Minor, and when he left the university, Amy Landis from Civil Engineering who is now gone as well, and now, David Freedman in CECAS has agreed to manage it. Agudelo stated that they would like to include organic farming in the program. Appling suggested that she contact Dr. Freedman. Kitchen stated that three courses that are taught for the minor do not mention the word sustainability throughout the course. Appling stated that Landis had recreated a few things before she left, so he believes perhaps this is why. Again, he suggested they discuss these issues with Dr. David Freedman.

Other Business

Spearman proposed the Education program change that was recommended by CHE for a non-certification option for students who do not pass the student teaching component needed to be licensed. Cook reminded the committee that this only pertains to one or two students per year.

Appling recommended removing the statement on page one, "did meet certification" or to delete the statement fully. He stated that the catalog must reflect exactly what we are actually doing, so the maps must be in the catalog. Someone from the committee suggested a footnote in the curriculum map since the programming is not really changing. Wolf recommended that they eliminate the open ended electives. Jackson encouraged the committee to accept changes since Education is currently out of compliance due to this issue. Wolf made a recommendation to accept changes discussed in principle with pending changes and the committee agreed. Cook will make the changes to reflect the committee recommendations, and the paperwork will move forward.

Trogden gave a brief overview of a timeline (attached) for the General Education Revision Task Force with a fall 2020 launch. She stated that this has not yet been reviewed or evaluated by the task force.

The meeting adjourned at 2:58 PM.
