Explanation: In our current curriculum for the Psychology BS, we have separate requirements for Departmental Math (3 credits), Departmental Life Science (8 credits), and Departmental Math or Science (5 credits). Each of these requirements requires additional credits beyond the GED requirements for math, science, and math or science. Thus Psychology BS students have to meet six different requirements regarding math and science. To simplify these requirements and give students more flexibility, we propose consolidating the three departmental requirements regarding math and science into one requirement entitled Departmental Math or Science (16 credits). The menu for the new, consolidated math/science requirement is in footnote 2 of the attached curriculum map. The attached curriculum map also rewords the description of the Psychology BS major requirements that appears above the curriculum map in the University Announcements. This rewording is included at the top of the attached curriculum map. This rewording is not a change in our curriculum. It only clarifies our current curriculum by presenting our Psychology BS course menus in terms of credit hours instead of courses.

Many Army ROTC students have assessed their own knowledge of American military history as being inadequate, and as a result have requested that a course on this subject be taught.
