

**Department of Pesticide Regulation Request to Place a Commercial Pesticide  
Applicator License into Inactive Status**

Submission of this request allows a commercial pesticide applicator to place his/her South Carolina Commercial Applicator license into an inactive status for up to five (5) years, beginning on the date this request is filed with the Department of Pesticide Regulation. All applicators requesting inactive status must continue to renew their certification annually, and maintain all recertification requirements during the period of inactivity. At the end of the five year inactive period, applicators must obtain the required insurance coverage and activate their license, or relinquish the license. No commercial pest control activities may be performed during the period of license inactivity. If any work is performed with an inactive license, this will constitute a violation of the Rules and Regulations for the Enforcement of the SC Pesticide Control Act, and violators will be subject to fines, license revocation, and/or other enforcement actions.
