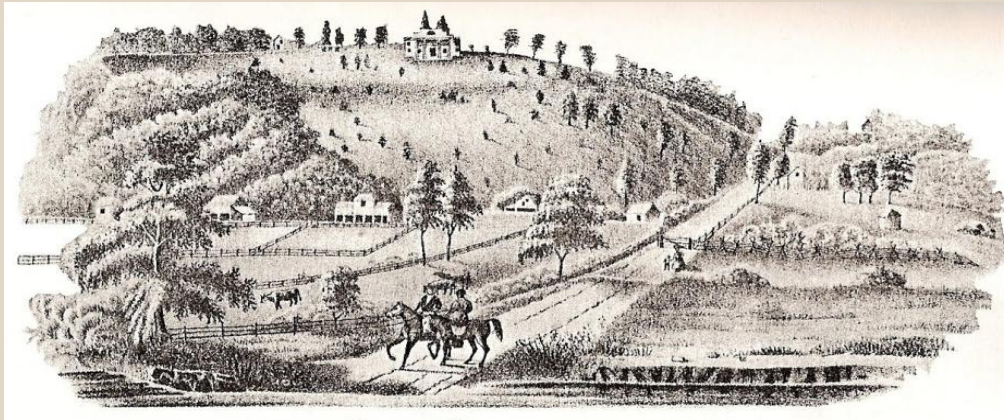

Twelve Mile Plantation

Keowee Heights was the plantation home of U.S. Senator John Ewing Colhoun, Sr. and his wife Floride Bonneau Colhoun. Their daughter Floride Colhoun married a cousin the honorable John Caldwell Calhoun. Floride eventually turned over the management of the estate to her eldest son, John Ewing Colhoun, Jr. His children included Martha "Cuddy" Colhoun author of Keowee Waltzes which included a sketch of the plantation on the cover of the sheet music. Their sons included Ransom Calhoun a West Point graduate who died in a duel with Alfred Rhett in Charleston during the Civil War.
