

Exercise #5 Conceptual Diagrams Symbols

Concept diagrams can be created with free-flowing media, such as pencils, felt tip pens, and colored markers. In landscape architecture, conceptual diagrams rely heavily on the use of visual symbols to represent various elements. These symbols provide a flexible and expressive approach to visualizing ideas and concepts.

On an 18"x 24" vellum sheet, draw 1"-inch margin, then divide the sheet into 4 sections after leaving place for a title block.

Squares are to be numbered from 1-4 starting from the top left to the bottom right. The numbers are to be written on the left top corner inside the squares.

Use lettering to write your name, exercise, square numbers, and title block.
