Dr. Ashlyn Hardie, from the Clemson University Sport and Recreation Management program, is currently seeking qualified applicants for a Ph.D. Graduate Assistantship starting in Fall 2024 or Fall 25. Prospective Master's students with industry and/or research experience are also invited to apply. This assistantship requires the student to be on-campus in Clemson, South Carolina during their 9-month contract (Fall and Spring semesters). In exchange for the students 20 hours of work per week, they will receive: (1) Full tuition waiver (student fees are not covered by the wavier), and (2) a stipend of \$18,000 (dispersed over 9 months). This assistantship is renewable for up to 4 academic years total for Ph.D. students (2 for Master's Students), contingent upon satisfactory performance. Additional pay may be available during the academic year and summer months to teach and/or work on grant-funded projects.

Responsibilities of the Graduate Assistant (GA) would include:

- Assisting in teaching and research activities
- Assisting with the development of data collection protocols and coordinating research activities
- Generating peer-reviewed products and working with collaborators
- Analyzing, summarizing, and reporting collected data
- Assisting in grant writing activities
- Presenting research findings at regional, national, and international conferences
- Creating and disseminating practitioner-friendly materials
- Any other scholarly assignments requested by Dr. Hardie

Topic areas that are the primary focus of Dr. Hardie's research include, but are not limited to:

- Stakeholder collaborations in the sport for development and peace (SDP) sector
- Strategic nonprofit management of SDP organizations
- Mitigating power dynamics and unintended harms of international collaborations
- Use of sport to address the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals
- Empowering women in sport
- Working across sectors, cultures, and borders

Preferred Oualifications:

- Career interest in an academic or practitioner position in the broader sport industry
- Experience participating, facilitating, working, and/or leading in the sport sector
- Interest in working on interdisciplinary or multi-disciplinary projects
- Some experience using qualitative and/or quantitative social science research methods (this can include monitoring and evaluation or analysis for annual reports for an organization)
