## HAW Landshut Germany courses for computer science students

The HAW Landshut summer semester starts in March and ends in July. The winter semester is less favorable for an exchange as it starts in September and ends in February, and courses may not be offered in English. Clemson computer science students can take a full semester of study during the HAW Landshut summer semester in the English language.

You do not need to know German prior to going to Germany, but you will learn some while there. You can also take classes in German as a second language at HAW Landshut.

Course that will substitute for CPSC 3520: [OK]

• Concepts of Modern Programming Languages (ECTS 5 units = 2.5 Clemson semester credit hours)

Courses that will be counted toward the Computer Science Technical Requirement (each is ECTS 5 units = 2.5 Clemson semester credit hours):

- Artificial Intelligence [OK—CPSC 3999 for Technical Requirement]
- Big Data Algorithms and Systems [OK—CPSC 3999 for Technical Requirement]
- IT Seminar [OK— 1 credit hour of CPSC 4810]
- Internet of Things [OK—CPSC 3999 for Technical Requirement]
- Secure Software Engineering [OK—CPSC 3999 for Technical Requirement]

Regarding taking classes in German for credit, there are two options for Clemson students (but these typically benefit only those with a German minor):

- Request that the GER department evaluate individual classes for equivalency at Clemson
- Have some sort of combination of classes approved by GER for GER 3600 (Summer Immersion).
  - Up to 6 credits of GER 3600 is possible.
