Course Description

This course, with adjustable credits, can be taken by M.S. and Ph.D. thesis graduate students for credits to conduct independent research under the instructor's advises per ECE graduate program requirements.

You will be required to maintain and communicate regular research progress proportional to the chosen credit load meeting the standards of the faculty advisor and the advisory committee.

Student Learning Outcomes

At the completion of the course, students should be able to make progress or complete their independent research and towards satisfying the ECE graduate program's thesis requirements.

Attendance and Class Cancellation Policy

Attendance at weekly meetings with the instructor is absolutely mandatory. Excuses for absences must be adequately documented. Students are expected to wait for 10 minutes, should the professor be late; vice versa.
