

DESCRIPTION

The 9-day program is designed to engage students in the history of medicine and medical research, starting by tracing the footsteps of Florence Nightingale, mother of modern nursing through Victorian London, and learning how a fine balance of compassion and innovation fueled the evolution of Britain's healthcare system. The program ends with a visit to Edinburgh to learn about the city's medical community.
