Join us as we explore topics ranging from the big bang theory to the soul through Greenville, SC artist Gerry Wubben’s large-scale works.

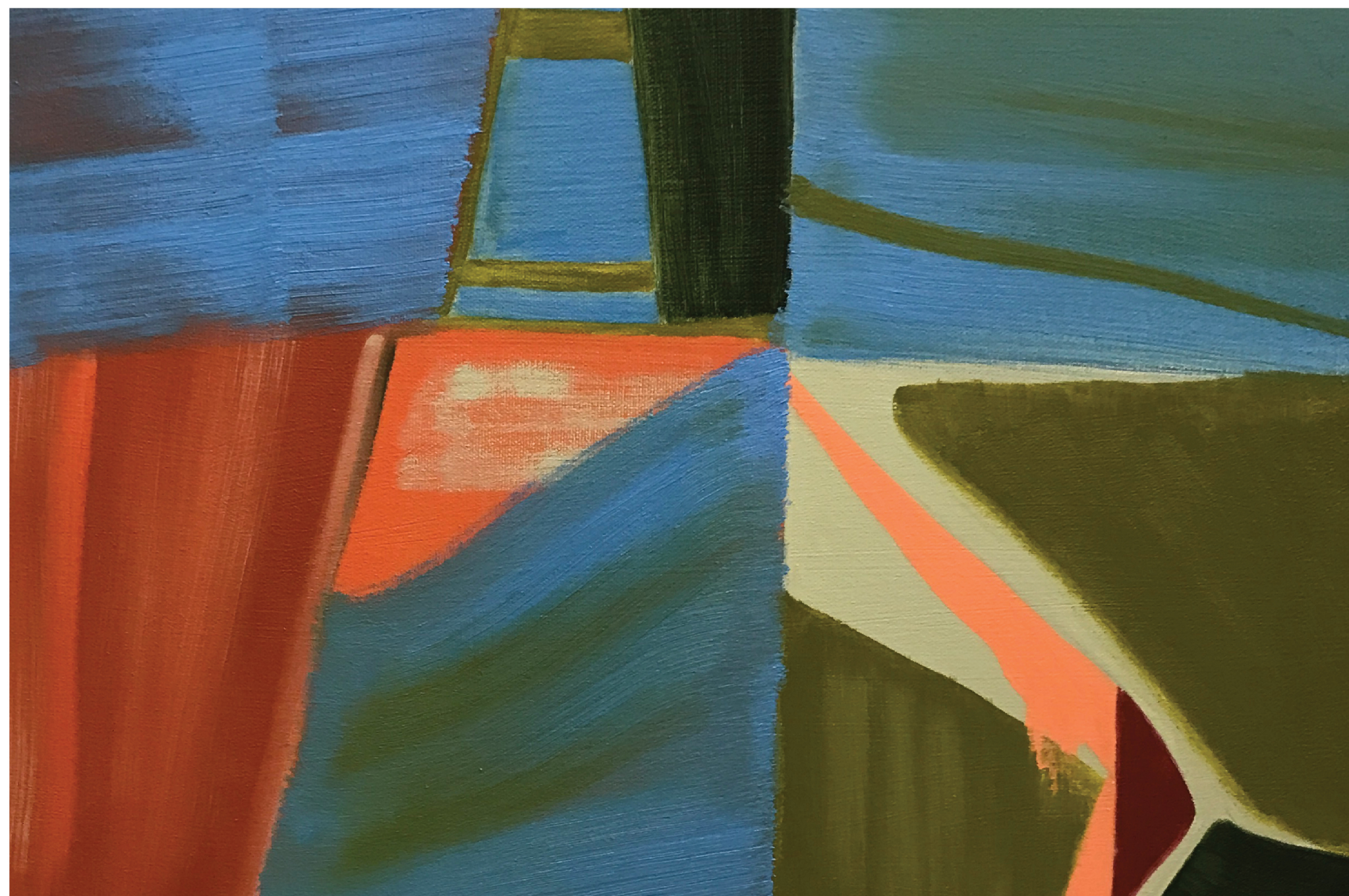


## A MOMENT OF JOY

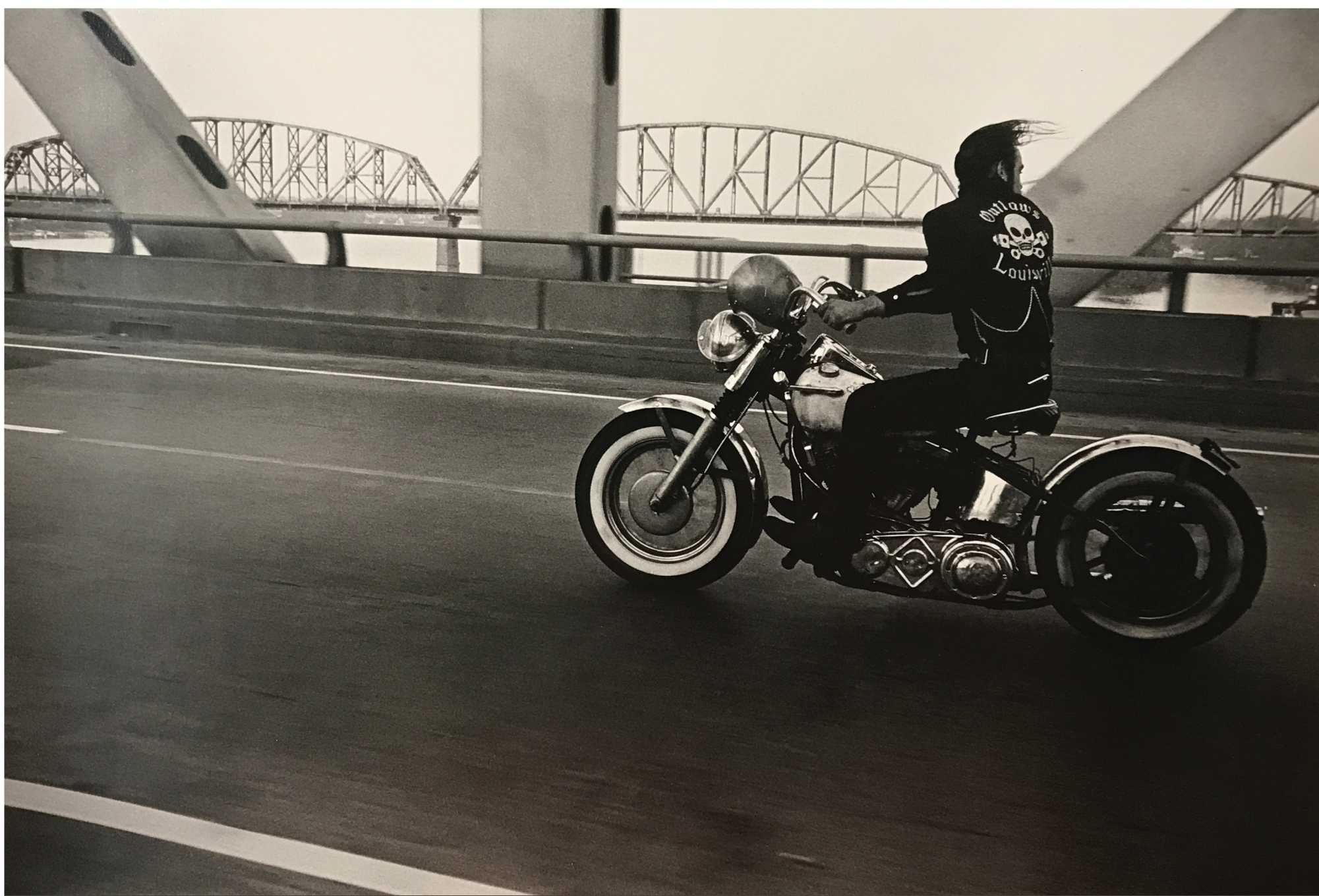


## ALTERED ABSTRACTION

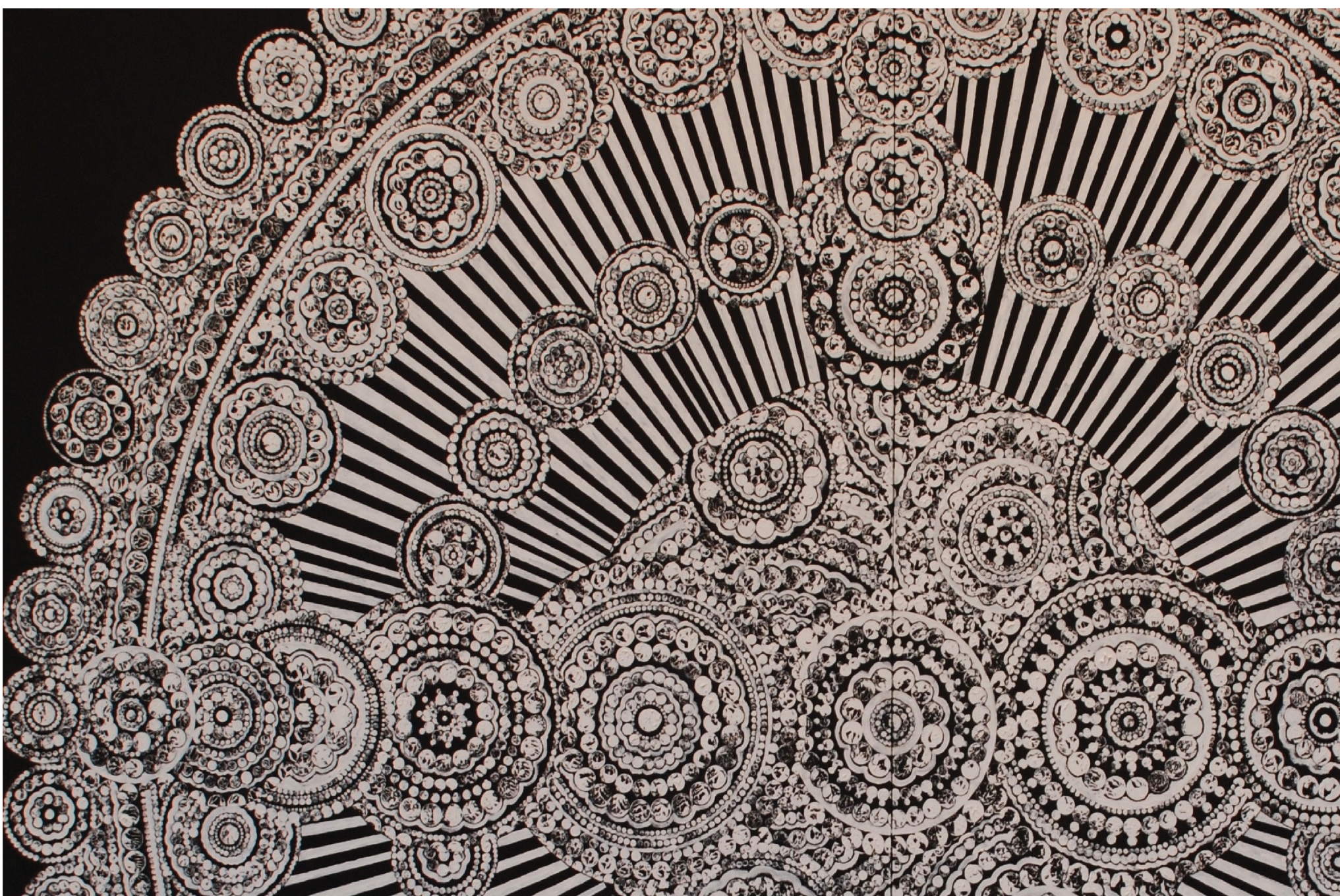


## WITNESS: A Reflection on Time, Isolation, and the Human Gaze

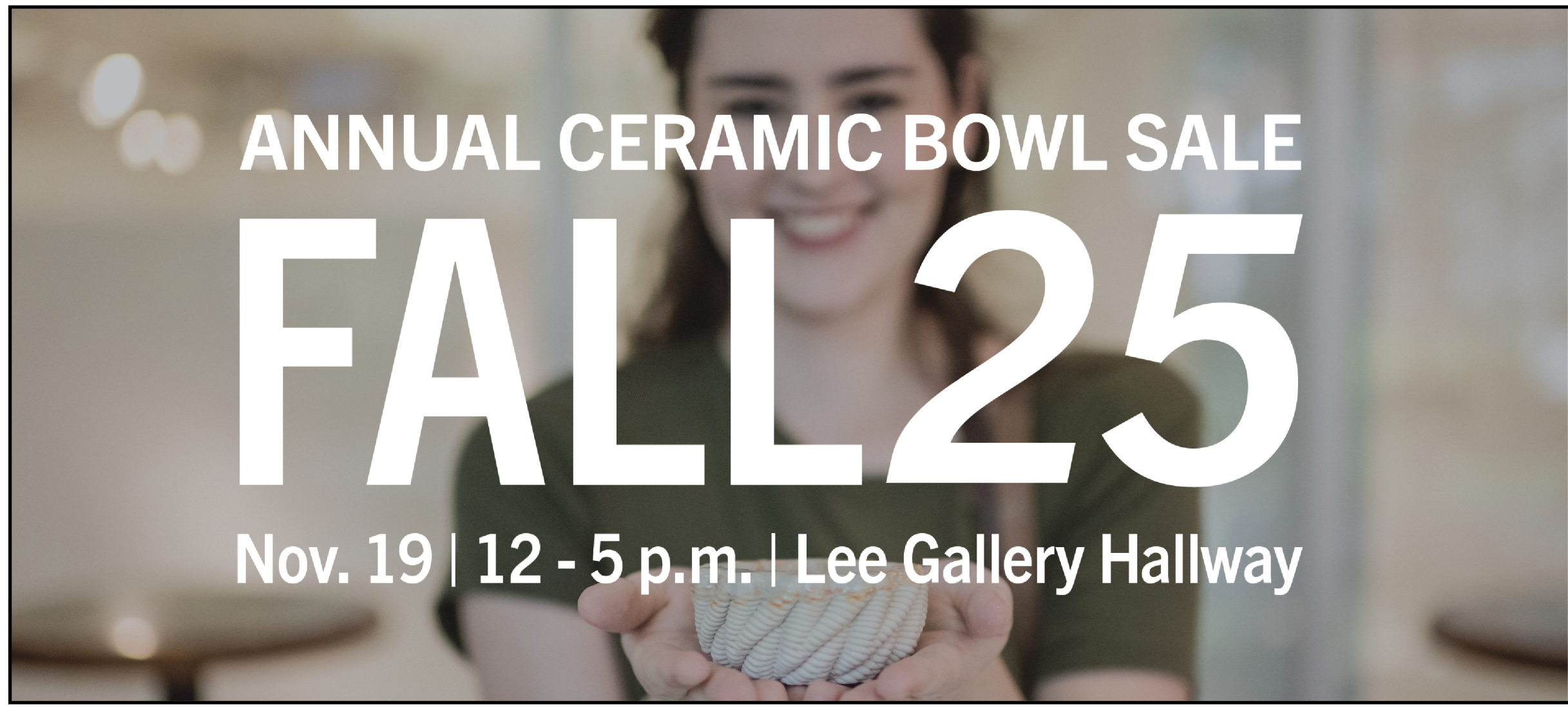
