GETTING READY FOR CAMP



Payment policy/information

A deposit (payable to Clemson University) must accompany the application (see specific camp application for amount details). A full refund will be given with written notice of cancellation received by January 15th. Until May 1st, camp fees are refundable minus the deposit. After May 1, no refund will be given.

Healthcare and Medical treatment:

Every camper is required to have a medical examination by a physician within one year of camp. Parents or guardians must complete health history forms, which will be forwarded to the camper upon acceptance of an application for attendance. If undue financial hardship is created by this requirement, contact the camp office. No camper may be accepted without a completed and signed health history, permission to treat and medical form.

Camp employs registered nurses that live in our camp health center. We operate the health center as a first aid station. The camp nurse is on duty at all times. Our camp physician or Redfern Health Center on the main campus of Clemson University is available for consultation. The nurses confer with the cabin staff on the daily health habits of campers and they also advise the administration regarding health matters. If our nurse or the camp physician thinks a camper needs treatment that we are unable to provide at camp, we have care available through Redfern Health Center or Clemson Health Center. We will notify you at once by phone if your child must stay in our health center overnight or has an accident.

Medications:

CONFIRM THAT AN ADEQUATE AMOUNT OF MEDICATION is packed for the entire session. Any remaining medication will be returned and packed in the luggage. Nurses will dispense medications beginning with Sunday supper and ending with Saturday breakfast. Please be sure that all medications due before supper on arrival day have been given before you leave. We cannot accept medications that are labeled with the camper's name and medication name. PLEASE follow the directions in the Medication Labeling section to unit does medications and bring original prescription bottles so the nurse can verify medications.

Supervision:

The Clemson University Outdoor Lab is committed to the protection and positive development of all campers and students. Outdoor Lab Leadership carefully selects counselors through an approved screening process that includes questions to highlight any red flags should there be any. To provide a camp community that is safe from all types of harm of our campers, all individuals who will be with campers undergo background checks, including classroom instructors. The Outdoor Lab Leadership prepares and conducts a youth protection training for all counselors to include identification and response of child abuse and neglect and emphasizes the importance of proper supervision. Lastly, no staff member and camper shall ever be together in a private space, including in digital settings such as chat rooms or on social media. The Outdoor Lab adheres to the "Rule of Three" indicating that there will always be at least two people with one or more campers.

Packing Instructions:

- -Pack simply and limit luggage size to one large plastic storage container (preferred) or one large suitcase.
- -Do not bring any electronics, food, or dangerous items. Any of these brought with the camper will be confiscated and returned at the end of the week.
- -Clearly label all of your child's clothing to prevent loss of personal items (we suggest putting initials on tags and in discrete places with a permanent marker). The Outdoor Lab is not responsible for items lost or stolen.

What not to bring:

Cabin placement:

Campers will be placed in cabins with campers of similar age and ability. Roommate requests will be considered, however, are not guaranteed.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

Arrival day:

Check in time is from 2:00 to 4:00 pm on arrival day. The camp staff will not be on duty until 2:00 pm. Vehicles arriving before 2:00 pm will be stopped at a checkpoint along the camp road until the start of registration. Please follow the 15 mph posted speed limit within camp and follow the signs to your designated camps registration area.

Departure day:

Please plan to arrive between 9:30 - 10:30 am. Once you arrive, please check in with a Head Counselor before proceeding to your camper's cabin. Please follow the 15 mph posted speed limit within camp.

WHILE AT CAMP

Birthdays:

We celebrate birthdays at camp! Your camper will be sung to and will enjoy birthday cake with all of camp. If your camper has a birthday while at camp, you may leave a card or small gift with the camp office on opening day and our staff will deliver it.

Visitation/phone:

Campers may not have visitors. Unexpected visits of family and friends may have a tendency to create homesickness. Campers are not allowed to use the phone during camp. Letter writing is strongly encouraged. Address all mail to the camper at this address:
