Faculty Manual

Chapter IV. The Faculty, Section C, 4 EMERITUS FACULTY, page 35 of the 2025-2026 of the Clemson University Faculty Manual states the following:

Emeritus Faculty

a. Faculty members, including teaching, research, and extension faculty, and library faculty, who have served at least five years at the University and 15 years in the academic profession receive the title of Emeritus or Emerita appended to their professorial rank upon official retirement from Clemson University.

b. In recognition of their service to the University, their honored place in the university community, and their ongoing capacities for advancing human knowledge and contributing to the intellectual and cultural life of the university, emeritus faculty as scholars have certain rights and privileges accorded by the Constitution of the Faculty of Clemson University. For example, they are members of the University Faculty and are welcome to participate fully in all meetings of the University faculty. Colleges and academic departments may extend similar invitations to their retired colleagues. Emeritus faculty not receiving University compensation may apply for the privilege of free parking through the Emeritus College.

Emeritus College Fact Sheet



Overview

Clemson University knows that retirement is an important time in your life, and retiring faculty have many options to maintain a robust relationship with the University. To make things less confusing, the Emeritus College and the Office of Human Resources partnered together to prepare this fact sheet.

The steps below will help you transition into retirement and ensure your membership in the Emeritus College.

Getting Things Started - Two Important Independent Steps!

Step I: Making Your Retirement Official

The Office of Human Resources provides steps to <u>prepare for retirement</u>. The South Carolina Public Employee Benefit Authority (PEBA) <u>website</u> provides helpful information regarding <u>retirement benefits</u>. (Eligible employees can apply for South Carolina Retirement System service retirement through their <u>Member Access</u> account.) For additional assistance, contact the Office of Human Resources via <u>Ask-HR</u> or by phone at 864-656-2000.

Step II: Enrolling in the Emeritus College

Visit the **Emeritus College website**. Then contact the Emeritus College team by email at **emerituscollege@clemson.edu** (attach a copy of your CV) or call 864-656-3990 to discuss your enrollment and eligibility.

What Happens Next?

The Office of Human Resources and the Emeritus College will collaborate on your behalf. Once eligibility is determined, the Emeritus College will require you to complete the online Applicant Data Form and will send a request to the Office of Human Resources to create an emeritus faculty record for you.

One Last Thing For You to Do!

After being notified by the Emeritus College that your emeritus record has been created, and once your retirement date arrives, you may process benefits, including applying online for your EMERITUS TigerOne Card which is needed to receive some of the many benefits listed on page 3.
