Chief Casey Bowling announced that the SEAL Program sends department employees out into the community daily to check on Seneca's seniors. This initiative is a testament to the department's dedication to ensuring the wellbeing of its older residents.

To be eligible, you must be 70 or older, living alone in a single-family home within the city limits. You will receive a phone call every morning saying, "Hey, how are you doing? Just to make sure their well-being during the day is good. If you don't answer the first phone call, you receive a second phone call. If there is no answer to the second phone call, an officer will go to the residence and attempt to contact you.
