Clemson University is a selective, public, land-grant university in a college-town setting along a dynamic southeastern corridor. Clemson's desire is to attract a capable, dedicated and diverse student body of approximately 12,000 to 14,000 undergraduates and 4,000 to 5,000 graduate students, with priority to students from South Carolina.

Graduate and continuing education offerings respond to the professions, while doctoral and research programs contribute to the economic future of the state, nation and world. The University emphasizes agriculture, architecture, business, education, engineering, natural resources, science and technology.
