DAC Construction Update

As you can see the new *DAC (Development / Alumni Center)* building is beginning to take shape. Last month final groundwork was completed. Footings and support walls were poured. The elevator shaft was built and the building's steel frame began to rise from the ground. As this work continues, we want to remind everyone to stay away from the construction areas as much as possible. Safety is Job One. Beginning on September 11th the north entrance to the

Beginning on September 11th the north entrance to the *Madren Center* will be closed in conjunction with this project work. We will also lose 25 parking spaces in the lot between the clubhouse and *Madren Center*. The north entrance will remain closed for the duration of the project. The only access to *Solé on the Green* will be through the front entrance of the *Madren Center*.

Also, the new 18th hole is near completion. Once the new retention pond stone wall construction is completed we will re-open the hole for play. Stay tuned for more updates.



Local Rule F-5 (2x2 Rule) Adopted for all play

"Relief from interference by an immovable obstruction may be taken under Rule 16.1.

The player has an extra option to take relief when such *immovable obstructions* are on or close to the *putting green* and on the *line of play*:

<u>Ball in General Area</u>. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1b if an *immovable obstruction* is:

- On the *line of play*, and is:
 - On or within two *club-lengths* of the *putting green*, and
 - Within two *club-lengths* of the ball.

Complete relief must be taken, which includes both physical and *line of play* interference.

Exception—No Relief If Line of Play Clearly Unreasonable. There is no relief under this Local Rule if the player chooses a *line of play* that is clearly unreasonable.

August Status

August was a strange month rain wise. While we recorded nearly 7 inches, 6 fell in two days. We had 4.1 inches on the 3rd and then 2.1 on the 28th! The rain on the 3rd caused the creek to get out a bit and we had some minor cleanup work to do. Otherwise, it was an average month weather wise.

It was a routine month maintenance wise as well. In addition to our regular mowing schedule, we were able to accomplish the following:

- Greens were verticut every Monday during the month and topdressed three times. Growth regulator was applied, and we groomed daily in conjunction with mowing.
- As we always do in August, we brushed and closely mowed the fairways early in the month to alleviate grain and prevent the bermudagrass from getting too fluffy and thick, providing a healthier, tighter surface.
- On Monday the 21st, we applied a slow-release nitrogen 19-0-25 fall fertilizer to all areas of the course.
- Lower #9 fairway was topdressed two more times this month, bringing the yearly total to 6 times. We're hoping to make one more application in early September.
- The natural areas on the course have been moved as scheduled. The "turnip patches" have been moved as well and we will be reseeding them soon. In addition, we have sprayed out an area right of 6 fairway and the high cut area between #7 and #8 will be seeded with fescue next month.
- Drainage installation on 1 fairway has been delayed again. Plans are to do this work the week of September 11th and we will play the hole as a par 3 while the work is going on.

September Goals

- Continue to verticut and lightly topdress greens as long as the temperature stays warm.
- Treat the course for fire ants which will be emerging with the (hopefully) cooler temperatures.
- Begin Spring Dead Spot control applications to greens, tees and fairways, once the soil temperatures reaches 72
- degrees. This is the temperature at which the pathogen becomes active and when fungicides are most effective.
- Apply a Potassium based fertilizer to the greens to assist hardening for the winter.
- Apply growth regulator to greens to control seed heads that occur around the third week of the month.
- Prep and re-seed natural areas on 2, 5 and 6.
- Prep and seed the areas on 6 and between 7 & 8 with fescue.
- Raise height of cut slightly on tees and fairways around mid-month to allow some additional growth prior to the onset of dormancy. This assists the bermudagrass in surviving the cold months of the year while it is not actively growing and gives us more of a base to withstand traffic during the winter months.

18th Hole Update

The turf on the new portion of the hole is maturing nicely. The green has matured to the point that it is being mowed and managed just like the greens on the course. However, we are still plugging out some of the off types that I discussed last month. The back of the green has been tied-in to the Alumni Center construction fence and the temporary path has been installed. Eventually, once the Alumni Center is completed, the hole will tie in to it.

If you have played recently, you have no doubt seen the large rock being stockpiled behind the pond and in the woods. This is the rock that we will be using to build the wall around the retention pond to enhance the look of the pond. We had hoped to have this work completed and the hole ready to open, but we are experiencing delays in getting the rock delivered. Thus, we are going to wait to open the new the hole until we can get the wall installed, as this work will be disruptive.

Home Lawn Tip

For those of you with warm season lawns who want to try to keep them weed free this winter, now is the time to apply a pre-emergent herbicide for winter annuals and poa annua (annual bluegrass). Most Home and Garden centers have a material in granular form that you can apply. A follow-up application in December or January will likely be necessary to achieve season long control.
