

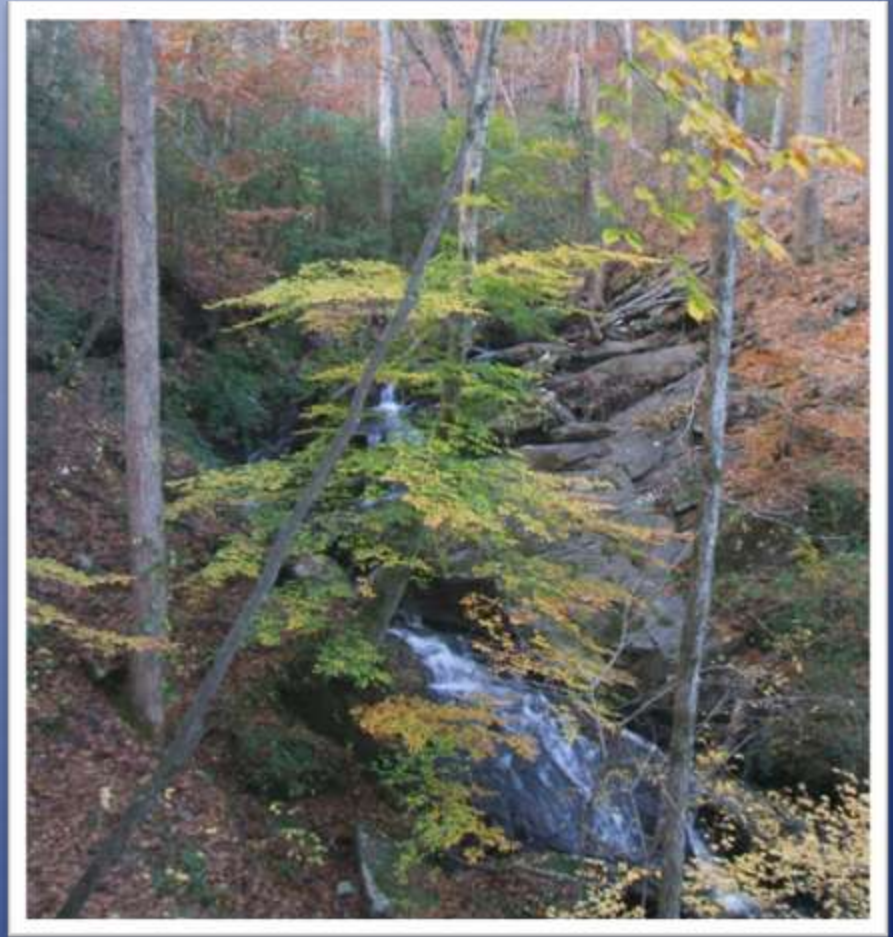
# **Waterfalls Project**

**Waldrop Stone Falls**

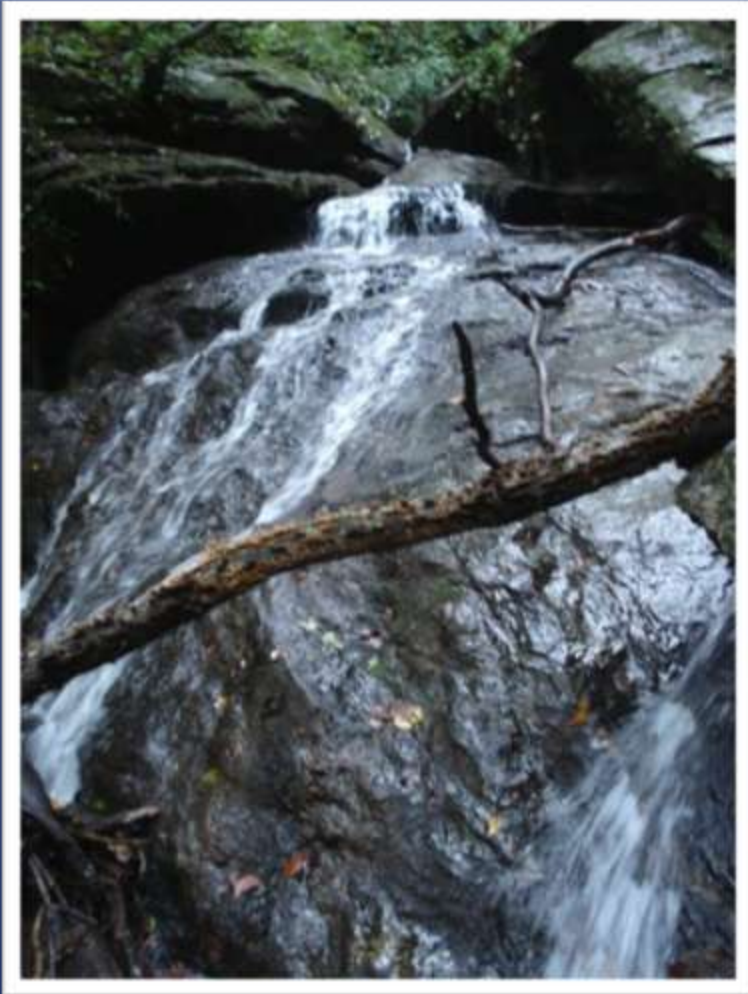

# About the falls

- Waldrop stone falls is located in the North Forest
- Approximately 50 feet in height



# Surrounding area



- Trees nearby include dogwood, american beech and mountain laurel.
- Other small plants include doghobble, poison ivy and sourwood.
- Area immediately surrounding falls is steep and rocky

# Getting there

- Leaving from subway – follow Highway 133 until it reaches a dead end at a stoplight (4 miles)
- Turn right and about a quarter mile on the left is Waldrop Stone Rd.
- You will go down a small hill, the trail is at the bottom adjacent to a creek
- Follow the trail (and the creek) and you will reach the falls in less than ½ a mile.



# On the hike

- The trail to the falls has been serviced by Boy Scouts
- Notice several signs and markers
- Other features of note
  - Contrast in slopes
  - Mountain creek habitat
