Designed to meet the needs of South Carolina's robust animal agriculture industry, the ambulatory service will provide on-farm and after hours care for cattle, small ruminants and horses, while also supporting backyard poultry and small-scale swine operations, particularly those connected to 4-H and youth programs. When fully operational, ambulatory services will be equipped with four state-of-the-art trucks. The service will bring advanced veterinary care directly to farms.

Based in the Ambulatory Services building on the new college’s campus, the service will initially provide daytime and after-hours veterinary care to farms within a radius of approximately 30 miles around Clemson, a region rich in livestock production. In the future, a truck will be available to serve farms outside of this 30-mile radius.

Most importantly, the program will serve as a cornerstone of the college’s teaching mission. The service will serve as one of the core rotations for all fourth year Clemson DVM students, giving those students the necessary opportunity to apply their classroom knowledge in real-world settings under the guidance of experienced practitioners.

SUPPORTS SC AGRICULTURE

Provides veterinary care for cattle, horses, small ruminants, backyard poultry and small-scale swine operations.

MOBILE VETERINARY CARE

Delivers advanced on-farm and after-hours veterinary services directly to producers through a fleet of specialized ambulatory trucks.

VITAL STUDENT TRAINING

Serves as a core fourth-year clinical rotation, giving Clemson veterinary students hands-on experience in real-world agricultural settings.

REGIONAL IMPACT

Initially serves farms within a 30-mile radius of Clemson, with plans to expand services across a broader region of the state.
